NOW WE KNOW

The most difficult part of preparing page, but, this month, that decision has been taken out of our hands following receipt of an email, on 2ⁿ March, from the Depute Clerk to the General Assembly, confirming that our request for a review of the Presbytery's mission plan and its decision to close LPC by 2026, has been rejected by the Mission Plan Review Group.

Our request was first submitted in August 2022, so it has taken six months to reach this decision. It is disappointing to note that the panel decided to proceed solely on the basis of the written submissions from the various parties involved and did not see fit to consider using other powers available to it, including, for example, having face to face meetings with local parties. But, it is what it is. The panel's decision is final and there is no scope for any further appeals.

So what happens next? This decision by the MPRG panel means that LPC and the other congregations in the Dalriada Mid-Argyll group (Ardrishaig, South Knapdale, North Kilmartin) can now Knapdale and move on to take a vote on whether or not to agree to the union of the congregations and, with exception of Ardrishaig and South Knapdale, whether Rev Carruthers should be the minister of the united congregation. You will be advised of the date of the vote but everyone needs to be aware only those attending the congregational meeting, which is

likely to be held after Sunday morning worship, will be allowed to vote.

Clearly, this is a disappointing decision for us as the congregation of Lochgilphead and will be felt beyond the doors of Lochgilphead Parish Church. However, assuming that the union is approved, it will be up to the Kirk Session of the new united congregation to decide what to do with the building and how to this newsletter is always trying to comply with presbytery's direction decide what should go on this front that the building be sold, let or otherwise disposed of by December 2026 and we should use the next 3 years to consider the possibility of closer ecumenical working with the other churches in Lochgilphead.

> Some will say that this is all part of God's plan for the Christian faith in Mid Argyll. Is it? Only time will tell. Please hold LPC in your prayers.

Treasurer Report

LPC Accounts for 2022 have now been completed and audited and are therefore ready to be presented to the Kirk Session and Congregation for approval at our Annual Stated Meeting, which is scheduled for **Sunday 12th March** after the Service. Copies of the Accounts will be provided to you at that time as normal and you will have the opportunity to ask questions on anything you are unsure of. You will see from them, that the General Fund (our working account) has more or less broken even in 2022, there being a small surplus of funds between Income and Expenditure, which is very encouraging.

I am therefore happy to report that we have started 2023 on a positive note with LPC finances, thanks to the generosity of the congregation. My hope is that with your support, this will continue ongoing throughout the year. Meanwhile, please keep using your FWO envelopes until such time as a firm decision has been made about the proposed union of the other vacant Mid Argyll Parishes (Dalriada Mid Argyll) at which time I will advise on any changes to your envelopes and/or the method of giving. I will continue to update you with any new information that I receive.

The other funds we have coming in from the Café and other social occasions is earmarked for maintenance and renovation of our Church, Hall and Manse when it becomes necessary and without these, we would be in dire straits as the General Fund could not begin to cope with this, so many thanks to Margaret and her team of volunteers for their valuable contribution.

I am very grateful to those of you who are still supporting us in any way, despite the present challenging times, so thank you all.

From that time on, this disciple took her into his home.' (John 19:26,27). 
The mother of three difficult youngsters was asked whether she'd have children if she had it to do over again. 'Yes,' she replied. 'But not the same ones.'
